
MW Bro Godfrey Place received a gift symbolizing masonic virtues from MW Bro Matthieu Lawson, **Grand Master of Benin**



What does this statement mean?

By so doing we dispel the negative myths which surround our Order, proving that we are men who are honourable, ethical and true.


Remember that the public judges our Order based on the behaviour of its members. Our actions as individuals will

determine how the public perceives our Order. We are the foundation on which the superstructure of the Order is judged. Weak foundations lead to weak collapsing structures. Our foundation needs to be so strong as to withstand not only the scrutiny of the public, but also of our fellow Brethren and of course our GAOTU.

If we live our lives in accordance with our obligation, we will show the world that no matter what challenges confront us, we can overcome them, and united in our belief that as Freemasons, we have the capacity to heal our fractured world.

As mentioned above, when we were obligated into the Order, we underwent a life changing experience. We are now Freemasons forever, which means 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. We are not Freemasons only when we don our suits and regalia and attend few Lodge meetings. We can make a difference in the day of every person with whom we come into contact, from the cashier in the supermarket, the car guard in the parking lot, our staff, the police at roadblocks, our friends and our families.

There is no "time-off" from Freemasonry, but it does not mean we forego the other aspects of our lives. It means we adapt our lives to demonstrate that we live as Freemasons according to our obligation, living in balance, being the best person.
