Get Yourself a Round Tuit!

A ROUND TUIT

This is a Tuit. Guard it with your life as Tuits are hard to come by, especially the round ones. This is an indispensable item. It will help you become a more efficient worker. For years we have heard people say, "I'll do it as soon as I get a round tuit." Now that you have one, you can accomplish all those things you put aside until you got a ROUND TUIT.

Brethren: Every one of us has essential administration in our lives. It is always there; whether business, social or personal. Most of us do not like it; but we have to accept that it has to be done. The problem is, of course, that we are always reluctant to define the time line. In many cases, by the time we get "a round tuit", it is last minute or too late.

I am sure that you will have had a chuckle when you read the above, but how true it is, even in the Order. If you are ever in doubt, just ask your Lodge Secretary for his opinion.

Every month he arranges for the wishes of the Worshipful Master to be communicated to the members and asks them to respond as to whether or not they will be attending the meeting. He does this, not because he is prying into the private life of the member, but because he has to organise the meeting. The Lodge may have a degree working to organise and this must be a "WOW" experience for the Candidate. This will not happen if the meeting is not organised properly and everyone plays their part.

Anyone who has been a Worshipful Master knows just how frustrating it is to find, after he has spent the month learning his part of the working in order to be as near to word perfect as possible, that the members who volunteered to perform a part of the working are badly prepared or do not turn up. Often the reason for the "no show", is to save embarrassment in being found to be wanting in the execution of a promise.

A Freemason is only as good as his word. His reputation is based on the fact that the "metaphorical handshake" is his bond. It is not a "maybe", to be considered only if he has time. If he commits to a course of action, it must be fulfilled if he is to remain credible. Too many broken promises indicate that we, as an Order, fail to make our Brethren understand that Freemasonry is primarily a process of facilitation through which he can improve himself. Just belonging will not make him a "better man"; it takes involvement and commitment. Has anyone ever become physically fit by subscribing to a gymnasium and never attending?

Brethren: It is essential that we get "a round tuit" in our Masonic lives. We are achievers and achievers get on with what has to be done. It is a question of purpose. Where do you want to be? Do you want to realise the object of Freemasonry in enabling you to improve yourself? Is this not a worthwhile expenditure of your precious time? Is this not what you joined for?

If you believe this to be true, then please respond promptly to the requests of your Lodge Secretary or the other Brethren striving to take our Order forward. They also have a desire to improve themselves through being Freemasons. By making them ask time and time again for your assistance in organising a meeting or Masonic activity, from which you will invariably benefit, you are unnecessarily wasting their time. Is it fair to prevent them from progressing towards their personal goals, just because you have not yet found your way clear to getting "a round tuit"?

The ceremony formed part of the AGM of the Supreme Council for Cote D'Ivoire and very well was attended. Member countries are Togo, South Africa, Benin, Cote D'Ivoire and Mauritius. Germany and the Republic of Congo were also represented.



The appointment

as the Confederation President is for two years and South Africa is to be the Head Office. The Statutes were formally approved at meetings which took place in the days leading up to the event.

The Supreme Councils and Freemasonry in particular were praised for their commitment to the work involved in uniting Africa.
