..... and now to get a "Round Tuit"

Brethren; the 2019 AGM has come and gone and it was truly a splendid affair. To those who were there and participated; we thank you most sincerely. Your presence was greatly appreciated. It is a fact that when the Temple is full, the ambiance transcends the norm and the Brotherly Love is most intense. To those who could not make the meeting; we missed you.

Last month we chuckled over the item in the title. This month, I wish to look at the more serious side.

Brethren, the Order is all about the members and their happiness. I believe that it relates to the rhetorical question; "*am I my Brothers' keeper?*"

We have been trying to promote the Almoners' program for some time now as part of a structural base for the manifestation of Brotherly Love and we have not achieved the participation levels that we had hoped for. The objectives of this program start with the individual Member and the effort to develop his commitment to show Brotherly Love at every opportunity. Remember; we took an oath on it!

There is a belief that if the Lodge appoints an Almoner, the job is done. This is so far from reality that it actually compromises one of our most precious principles. Brotherly Love is a personal concept and cannot be delegated to a third party. It is what we do and not something that can be fully institutionalised. The Almoner is merely the coordinator of the efforts of each Brother to make a difference. "Every man is our Brother we must work for all ...".

In the Lodge, our immediate Brethren face many challenges in their daily lives. They are no different to each of us; we also face similar challenges every day. If we sometimes need a shoulder to cry on; why shouldn't they? Do we offer ourselves to fulfil that role when needed? Do we listen when they need a confidant?

Happiness is an ethereal concept and difficult to define. It is many things to many people. What we can define is unhappiness and this is something we all have a handle on. One of the most powerful stimulants of unhappiness is a sense of being alone when confronting a crisis. Having no-one that you can trust to talk to. Noone with whom you can share ideas; confident in the knowledge that they will not be used against you later.

Brethren; is this not what Brotherly Love is all about? Being there for a Brother through thick and thin? Sharing your time with him in the generation of possible solutions to his problems. Just asking if you can help. The empathy generated by this question has proven so powerful in making a person feel better. Just by reassuring him that he is not alone.

Brethren; it is time to get a "round tuit" and to take time to make a real difference in the life of a Brother. What you share with the Lodge Almoner depends, of course, on the sensitivity of the situation. But; If everyone made a phone call to find out why a Brother was not at Lodge last night and respected the "safe" information shared, I am sure that the Brethren in the Lodge would soon find a way to act upon it and demonstrate their Brotherly Love.
