Past, Present and Future

Freemasonry requires that its members must know themselves and the Volume of the Sacred Law has many references to this, which is why most of its principles and tenets are based on the teachings contained therein. Jordan Petersen, a non-Freemason and a renowned Psychologist, holds the view that the way to know oneself is to understand that you do not and that once you accept this fact, you should have the humility to recognise your ignorance of who you are and who you could be. This progressive step by our immediate Past Grand Master epitomises the characteristics of a true Freemason who has learned to know himself and who wasted no time in ensuring that our Grand Lodge enjoyed a smooth and stress free transition of leadership. As he still has much to offer to Freemasonry in general and our Grand Lodge in particular, I am pleased that he has accepted a position as one of my senior officers and advisors.

The present pandemic has affected all our lives and the way in which we used to enjoy our Freemasonry and most of our Lodges are conducting their monthly business meetings and holding lectures and discussions on Masonic topics via Zoom. The Provincial Grand Lodges are successfully conducting their meetings in the same manner. A large number of our members have seized this opportunity to become more proficient in the rituals; to read their Masonic "Book of Life", to log into the many and varied lectures and discussions on Masonic topics which are being offered via the electronic media and even to don their PPE and offer their services at charitable havens like our Masonic Homes, shelters for the homeless, soup kitchens and at places where assistance is offered to persons less fortunate than themselves. These members are not only adhering to but are actively promoting the Golden Rule, "do unto others as you would have them do unto you".

Grand Lodge has recently been registered as a Public Benefit Organisation, which means that any person or body who donates any money to it may be entitled to certain tax relief. The initiative started by our Past Grand Master during the lockdown to raise money for a charitable project was successful and will enable us to feed a large number of persons and to offer financial assistance to our members whose businesses have been adversely affected by this pandemic.

Our fund raising committee will be working hard to ensure that its projects will enable our benevolent fund to continue to assist persons in need. Our Public Relations and Social Media committees will continue to ensure that Freemasonry and our Grand Lodge has the attention of the general public. Our Education committee is producing invaluable material which our members are encouraged to access via Grandview to enhance and improve their Masonic knowledge. In 2022 we will be celebrating 250 years of Freemasonry in South Africa and our Heritage committee has commenced planning for these festivities.

Although we are uncertain when our normal Masonic activities will resume, do not be despondent as we have so much to be grateful for. While we mourn the loss of all who have passed on as a result of the Covid virus, everyone who is able to access and read this message has not only survived it but has been blessed with eyesight, hearing, intellect and certain financial ability. We will therefore use our time wisely in the interim and continue to strive to make better men and a better world where all persons can live in harmony and peace with each other and the environment, so keep well and stay safe.






