Grand Master Elect's Abbreviated AGM Address

I wish to thank the Immediate Past Grand Master and the Grand Secretary for their tireless commitment to the Grand Lodge. In addition to the special Awards of Excellence, there are many other members who sacrifice their time, energy and money to ensure that their Lodges, the Provincial Grand Lodges and the Grand Lodge are managed properly. To all these worthy Brethren, I thank you most sincerely for your continued zeal and enthusiasm. I have taken over a fully functional and dynamic Grand Lodge. As every member of our Grand Lodge, irrespective of rank or position, has the opportunity and, indeed, the responsibility to help us shape our future, I will depend on each and every member to provide opportunities to make other good men better and thereby ensure that we leave a legacy of which we can be justly proud.

To ensure that we achieve our Aim and Objectives, we need members who want to be Freemasons and who comply with their obligations. To achieve this, I want our Lodges to read the Aim and Objectives of the Grand Lodge at every Board of Management Meeting so that we can be reminded of these very important foundations of our Masonic structure. It will devote equal time to the Recruitment and Retention of members, to Ritual excellence, to Social activities, to Masonic Education and to Charity and will be a haven for its members and their families and a place wherein they will, not only be exposed to the principles of Freemasonry, but where they will become better persons while they enjoy themselves doing so.

I therefore encourage every member to make it a daily habit to log on to GrandView to read the latest news. I also encourage you all to regularly visit the Grand Lodge website and to refer it to your family and friends.

I will chair the Grand Lodge Benevolent Committee. We have progressed well with the Charity initiative which was introduced shortly after the lockdown. I am confident that many of our Lodges will seize the opportunity to ensure that distressed and orphaned children in our Country do not go hungry and that they will make this an ongoing charitable project.

MW Bro Geoff Edwards OSM will chair the Education Committee. Apart from producing invaluable

Masonic educational material, which will be available on GrandView, the Cadet Program, the Leadership Program, the Mentorship Program, the Advancement Program and the Ritual Excellence Program will all be managed by this Committee.

MW Bro David Duncan OSM will chair the Finance Committee and the Foreign Relations Committee. The Finance Committee will continue assisting Lodges to manage their finances. As Grand Lodge has been registered as a Public Benefit Organisation and is able to present Section 18A receipts, donors will now be able to claim certain tax relief. Although we are in Amity with more than 100 Grand Lodges, he will use his experience and diplomacy to expand our foreign relations and so increase our Amity with the Grand Lodges who have sought recognition from us. Many of our members will be identified and will be appointed as representatives to these foreign Grand Lodges.

RW Bro Brandon Topham will chair the

Investment Committee and the newly established Entrepreneurial Development Committee. All Lodge investments, funds raised and donations received will be properly invested until they are actually required.



The newly formed Fund Raising Committee will be

chaired by RW Bro Alf Bronner and I am confident that they will raise sufficient money which will enable the Grand Lodge Benevolent Fund to financially assist our own members as well as non-Freemasons, when the need arises in the future. I therefore request all members to give your full support to all fund-raising initiatives, which will enable us to make meaningful donations to worthy causes in the future.

RW Bro Avron Jacobson MSA will chair the Technology and Social Media Committee. They have introduced many of us to the modern technology during the past few months through their facilitation of online communication. They are also responsible for the success of today's communication and for the Grand Lodge website, which is regularly updated and which is receiving an increase of visitors every week.

RW Bro Alan van der Vyver will chair the Public

Relations and Marketing Committee. As the general public either does not know what Freemasonry is or may have a negative perception thereof, he and his committee will successfully promote Freemasonry and will make it a positive topic of



conversation in every household in this country.

RW Bro Tommy Hardiman will chair the Ritual

Committee, which will ensure that our Rituals remain pure and relevant and will continue to support and maintain our Aim and Objectives. They will also review any new ritual needs.

RW Bro Godfrey Place will chair the Constitution, Regalia and Procedures Committee. As the Constitution is a living document, they will ensure that it is kept up to date with our ever changing World.

The new Heritage Committee has been formed



to safeguard the rich history attached to our Grand Lodge. It will be chaired by RW Bro Brian Rossouw OSM. As Freemasonry was established in South Africa in 1772, we will all be assisting Lodge De Goede Hoop to celebrate its 250th birthday in 2022. This committee will also collect and collate all the historical documents of our Lodges and will ensure that they are properly archived so that we can leave an accurate and meaningful legacy for the future.

Grand Master's Covid Feeding Scheme

"Freemasonry is a caring organisation" and being aware of Covid-19 allied challenges, such as children being unable to obtain sufficient food to sustain them adequately, the immediate Past Grand Master, MW Bro Dave Duncan OSM, decided that we would show how much we cared by helping some of the most needy.



MW Bro Duncan set the members of GLSA a target of a quarter of a million Rand and, much to his delight, the reaction well exceeded our expectations and the amount was more than achieved. This meant that we could now look at the most effective way of providing some real assistance. Supported by the Provincial Grand Masters, the "Feeding

1,000 children for a 100 days" initiative was launched around South Africa. and a very tasty vanilla flavoured porridge is now enjoyed daily by some 1,000 recipients.

To distribute the porridge most effectively, the Provincial teams got involved and delivered the 5 kg bags through a variety of outlets such as foster homes or orphanages around the country. This short report explores just a few of these initiatives.

Northern Division found a real need in Mamelodi and, working along with the Viva Foundation, they are now feeding 300 children for the 100 days. I'm given to

believe that one of their Lodges plans to extend the end date but hope to tell you more about that next month. The Division is also feeding 50 children at Thato Ke Matla Orphanage Thato's "angel" Disebo with and continues to support



Wor Bro Souami Mabiala the Walking Tall Feeding Scheme on a monthly basis.

Southern Division had RW Bro Tommy Hardiman and Wor Bro Cobis Wilson do a delivery tour visiting orphanages in Wellington, Robertson, Piketberg and Mooreesberg. They delivered a total of 104 x 5 kg bags



of porridge which equates to feeding 140 children for 100 days. The children are much enjoying the meals being provided and love the taste of their new breakfasts. The

Wor Bro Cobis Wilson message from Huis van Heerde (Mooreesberg) summed up the impact that we are having on needy lives and our Brethren really are delighted to have been able to contribute.

In Central Division, RW Bro Frans Appelgryn and his team have also decided to focus on the desperately hungry in the outlying areas and are feeding 50 needy children in Reddersburg and 30 more in Wepener.

also presented them with clothes, toys and other items. In the Eastern Cape, RW Bro Keith Hutton and his team assisted orphanages in both East London and in Port Elizabeth. As is seen below, the Freemasons and their families all had a great time being involved.

Reading of the GLSA's Aims and Objectives

The Grand Master Elect, RW Bro John Smith OSM MSA, has decreed that the Aims and Objectives of the GLSA will now be read at all Lodge Board of Management meetings, with immediate effect. This must be



included on the Agenda straight after the Opening Prayer. The material to be read will be available in English and Afrikaans and the English version reads:

The AIM OF THE GRAND LODGE OF SOUTH

AFRICA is to build a multi-cultural brotherhood of good men who practice brotherly love, charity and truth and who are united in the enhancement of wisdom, high moral standards and justice for all persons. The strict adherence to these principles will inculcate the duties of loyalty, good citizenship and family values in its members and will promote reconciliation between and mutual respect of all persons. They will further strengthen the members' belief in a Supreme Being and will encourage the practice of equality of all persons and the adherence of human rights for all persons. They will also ultimately build stronger bonds of true friendship among its members.

It is THE OBJECTIVE OF THIS GRAND LODGE:

- 1. to encourage all free-thinking men who wish to and who may already contribute to peaceful and poverty—free communities, to become members;
- 2. to encourage every member to adopt high moral and ethical standards in his daily life;
- 3. to encourage every member to expand on and improve his spiritual growth and to share this with all persons with whom he comes into contact;
- 4. to make a good man a better man by encouraging him to know, understand and practice the lessons to be learned in the VSL, the Rituals and the Protocols and Customs of the Order;
- 5. to encourage the development of every member's social and spiritual character which will let him understand his weaknesses and take steps to overcome them;
- 6. to empower every member to implement what he has learned and thereby uplift the society in which he lives;
- 7. to inculcate the concepts of truth, integrity, brotherly love and charity in every member's life and make these a part of his being.
