Masonic Advancement

We learn from a young age that there is certain structured advancement in life in which we are expected and encouraged to participate. We encounter this in our own family circle, in school, in team sports, in tertiary education and in employment. I also encountered the concept of advancement in Freemasonry when I became a member. Although I well remember the feeling of attachment and friendship from the Freemasons who were present at my initiation, it was quite obvious that certain members knew more and occupied more senior positions in the Lodge than others. These included my late father and others who were all much older than I was. I had been warned to be prepared to reply to a toast which would be proposed to me at the festive board and I was duly instructed in the correct protocol. I am sure that my response was less than adequate but it still received a hearty round of applause.

I soon learned that Freemasonry is vast and complex and requires much study and understanding to appreciate its true meaning, symbolism, aims and structures. In essence, it endeavours to create an aspiration in every candidate, of whatever age, to an ennobled manhood. Embodied in its symbols is a philosophy of moral idealism, which is based on profound spiritual truths. The object of the initiation ceremony with its peculiar rites and practices is intended to impress certain moral lessons indelibly on the mind of the candidate. He is instructed to learn to know himself and thereby realise his own capabilities and shortcomings. He is also introduced to the symbols

of that degree which assist to point out the advantages of further education which will, inevitably, lead to his advancement. Although men differ in intellect and ability, all can aspire to something worthwhile in this life if they persist in their attempt to accomplish it.

To some men Freemasonry opens up more slowly than to others and they do not catch its spirit or feel its appeal and so they become bored, disinterested and indifferent. Some resign, never to return, while others return after several years with a new perspective and then start enjoying the benefits Freemasonry offers.

As an Apprentice we are reminded to apply the golden rule: "do unto others as you would have them do unto you". We are further encouraged to practice the principles of morality and uprightness in our daily lives so that the World may see us as men of honour and high moral character, without needing to be aware that we are Freemasons. Plato, considered by many as the father of all philosophers, described man as part angel and part beast and said: If man does not aspire to be an angel, he will descend to the level of the beast.

It is therefore obvious why Freemasonry adopted both St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist as its Patron Saints. The Baptist was a just man, intolerant of sham or pretence. He was a man of strength and fervency, uncompromising of evil or expediency and yet a humble, sincere and magnanimous person. The Evangelist was gentle and loving. He was the bringer of comfort to the grief stricken, of courage to the weak, of help to the helpless and of strength to the failing.

Freemasonry is an organisation of men who strive to live by the fundamental principles of integrity, goodwill and charity. It gives a man an opportunity to do and to be something he otherwise may not be able to attain on his own. It also strives to replace self-interest with an interest in others and we are taught that without ennoblement of mind and heart and without steady perseverance in good works, the whole essence of Freemasonry dwindles into nothing and all its symbols and usages become a meaningless farce and a vain toy.

Nelson Mandela said: Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the World.

As we advance through the degrees from Apprentice to Master Mason and through the Lodge offices from Steward to Presiding Master, let us therefore embrace all that Freemasonry can teach us and become better men and thereby become better husbands, better fathers, better employers and better brothers and so help to make the world a better place for our families, our friends and ourselves to live in.

President Burgers initiates Bro Omolema Sepato



Assisting the Apprentice on his Journey

One of the challenges that we have, is to ensure that new members get the maximum benefit from their Masonic journey. They come in with high expectations and it is our duty to see that their dreams are fulfilled.

Interestingly enough, our Constitution includes a sub-article 112.4 - After initiation, no member shall be advanced to the next degree unless he has met the proficiency criteria as determined by the Grand Committee from time to time. That was clearly there for a reason, but it needed to be properly applied.

To address this, RW Bro Godfrey Place, together



with his PGL Officers and the Education Committee, have put together "Advancement Criteria" which enable Brethren to be assessed on their activity level, knowledge and understanding as they make progress between the different degrees. We will take the Apprentice as an example.

RW Bro Godfrey Place Before he will be allowed to be passed to the Fellowcraft degree, he will have to have met the following "Advancement Criteria";

- Attended at least 5 Lodge Business Meetings;
- Regularly attended all of his Lodge's workings held in the 1st or Apprentice degree.
- Made a minimum of 6 visits to other Lodges.
- Actively participated in and delivered a charge in at least 1 floor working.\
- Successfully passed the Apprentice Questionnaire, as provided on GrandView.
- Presented a paper entitled "Know Thyself" and answered any questions arising from it.
- Completed and submitted Mentors and Visits Control Sheets, as found in the Book of Life.

While these Criteria aren't, and are not intended to be, particularly onerous, they will require that the Lodge and the Apprentice get fully involved in the new Brother's progress. Right at the outset of his journey, the new Apprentice will be assigned his own personal Mentor and it will be this Brother's responsibility to guide the new Apprentice and ensure that he is aware of and fully understands just what is expected of him.

The Mentor will update the Apprentice on how to access and use GrandView; what meetings he should attend, where and when they are and what the dress is; how he should address and interact with the various Brethren. He will arrange relevant visits; assist him with his first charge; guide him through the material to be tested on; provide answers to the many questions that the enthusiastic Apprentice is likely to have.

The requirements for each degree will be detailed in the Book of Life - Apprentice = Section 2.4.
