members of the Masonic complex in Bloemfontein, which is owned and operated by all four Constitutions and which has donated R50,000,00 to the Freemasons in Kwa-Zulu Natal to assist all members there who have been adversely affected by the civil unrest.

The vision and the excitement on achieving our goal will pull us along.

Johan (left) shared this with his fellow PGMs and, without any hesitation, they had reacted as one, raised R200,000 and were looking for the best way to assist. This included

food relief, even to the point of arranging "mercy flights" to the areas involved.

In his email, Johan says that "Every Division of the GLSA was simply amazing in their moral and other support, and we knew that Grand Lodge had our backs because the Grand Master became involved personally."

"RW Bro Tommy Hardiman initiated the talks among the PGMs and coordinated relief efforts."

"RW Bro Godfrey Place used all the resources at his disposal to boost the planning of possible food relief, even to planning air couriers if needed."

"RW Bro Keith Hutton pledged funds from his Division and himself and drew attention to a Brother from Eastern Cape who was in Natal and in distress."

"RW Bro Frans Appelgryn mobilised the Free State Brethren from all Constitutions and they raised an additional R50,000 of support and made a real difference with their food support efforts."

Overall, Brethren the support was quick and quite outstanding and makes me very proud to be a Mason.



RW Bro Brian Rossouw OSM

Brian was appointed as the Chairman of the Heritage Committee a year ago and was tasked with
