South African Freemasonry - the first 50 years

Lodge De Goede Hoop was formed in Cape Town on 2 May 1772. In 1778 Bro Francois Duminy, who had been initiated in France, joined the Lodge. Between 1772 and 1781 1st and 2nd degree meetings were held on the same day and the presiding master was elected and was installed on St John the Baptist's day, being 24 June. Sea-faring Brethren were regularly passed to the Fellowcraft degree and / or raised to the Master Mason's degree and more than 400 degrees were conferred by the Lodge during this time. In 1784 a war in Europe saw ships stop calling at the Cape. As there were too few permanent Cape resident members, the Lodge returned its Charter to the GEN.

Lodge De Goede Hoop reopened on 24 June 1794. 11 Brethren, who were then permanent Cape residents and 7 of whom were previously Lodge members, were involved. The Lodge rented premises in Plein St and Bro Duminy was elected as the master. The previous By-laws were amended in that 3 months had to elapse before an Apprentice could be passed to Fellowcraft and 12 months before a Fellowcraft could be raised to Master Mason. Bro Louis Thibault, a French architect and a Freemason in France, became a member of the Lodge and Johannes Truter was initiated.

After the British occupation in 1795 most English Freemasons who arrived at the Cape could not speak Dutch and did not attend Lodge De Goede Hoop's meetings. The Lodge however gave them permission to use their Temple for Masonic work, provided that no initiations took place and no degrees were conferred.

This, however, saw several irregular Lodges formed, which were not recognised by Lodge De Goede Hoop. In 1797, Anton Anreith, the renowned German sculptor was initiated in Lodge De Goede Hoop. In 1799 Bro Truter was installed as the Lodge's presiding master and, in 1800, it established a daughter Lodge, called Loge St Jan de Goede Trouw, this later changing to Lodge De Goede Trouw. During the same year Lodge De Goede Hoop purchased its present property, being the garden Domburg and Bro Thibault was commissioned to draw the plans for a Temple. The dimensions of the main Temple are identical to those of the Sanctum Sanctorum of King Solomon's first Temple as described in the book of Kings. A member of the Lodge, Bro Herman Schutte, was employed to build the Temple while Bro Anreith was to sculpt 7 statues, 3 of which still exist today. Sadly, no record of the laying of the foundation stone exists.

In 1802 the Cape became a colony of the Batavian Republic and Bro Jacob De Mist arrived as the Governor. Lodge De Goede Trouw purchased a property in Plein Street, near to De Goede Hoop, which it converted into a Temple. The De Goede Hoop Temple was completed and consecrated on 7 July 1803 by Bro De Mist, who was also a Deputy Grand Master of the GEN. He presented an endorsed charter to the Lodge confirming its 1772 formation date. In 1804, before he left, Bro De Mist appointed Bro Truter as the Deputy Grand Master National of the GEN.

In 1811 several English-speaking members of the 2 Dutch Lodges petitioned the Grand Lodge of England to establish an English speaking Lodge in Cape Town and the British Lodge was duly formed. It was consecrated by Bro Truter, who also installed the first presiding master. In 1811 a Chapter of Knights of the East and the Sword and the Rose Croix Chapter L'Orient et L'Epee was formed. In 1812 Lodge De Goede Hoop gave a portion of its land to the City to establish a street, provided that it was named St John's Street in honour of the Patron Saint of Freemasonry. This still exists today. The British Lodge purchased a property close to Lodge De Goede Hoop. In 1813 De Goede Hoop established an education fund, which still operates today. In 1814 a new refectory for Lodge De Goede Hoop was built, which later housed the first parliament of the Cape Colony. In 1815 Bro Anreith was appointed as the principal of the first technical school for boys, which was sponsored by the 3 Cape Town Lodges. In 1818 the first military Lodge under the English Constitution was formed, being the Union Lodge. In 1820 Bro Truter was knighted and known as Sir John Truter. In 1821 Lodge De Goede Hoop petitioned the UGLE to grant a warrant to establish a Lodge for its English-speaking members. The Hope Lodge, no 727 on the roll of the UGLE, was formed. It

worked according to the By-laws of Lodge De Goede Hoop and the Constitution of the UGLE.
