Freemasonry in South Africa: 1822 – 1872

South African Freemasonry began with the formation of Lodge De Goede Hoop on 2 May 1772. This was under the GEN in Cape Town. By 1822 there were only 5 Masonic Lodges, all in Cape Town. 2 were under the GEN, 2 under the UGLE and 1 under both jurisdictions. During the next 50 years, 36 Lodges were formed: 15 under the GEN, 18 under the UGLE, 2 Scottish Constitution and 1 French Constitution. 8 Lodges were formed in the Western Cape, 15 in the Eastern Cape, 2 in Natal, 7 in the Free State and 4 beyond the Vaal River.

In 1823 Lodge De Goede Hoop formed a property committee to administer the property - and it still does so today. They petitioned the Grand Orient of France, in 1824, to establish a local French Lodge for its French speaking members. Warrants for Lodge L'Esperance and for the Council Kadosh L'Esperance were received in 1826 and the French Rose Croix Chapter L'Esperance in 1827. This Lodge, council and chapter followed the same principle as The Hope Lodge regarding adherence to the different statutes. The Presiding Master of Lodge De Goede Hoop and The Hope Lodge, Bro Neethling, was elected as the first Presiding Master of Lodge L'Esperance, making him the Master of 3 Lodges at the same time, being Dutch, English and French. The members of the Lodges in Cape Town participated in laying the foundation stone of St Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Somerset Road, which still exists today. In 1828 Sir John Truter was appointed by the UGLE as the first Provincial Grand Master of its Provincial Grand

Lodge. He appointed Bro Neethling (GEN) as his Deputy and Bro Burton (EC) as the Provincial Grand Secretary. In 1828 the first Lodge was formed in the Eastern Cape, the Albany Lodge (EC). In 1830 about 400 Freemasons participated in laying the foundation stone of St George's Cathedral in Adderley Street. In 1834 the third GEN Lodge was formed in Graaff-Reinet, being Lodge De Vereeniging. In 1835 Bro Burton was appointed as the PGM of the EC.

In 1840 Lodge De Goede Hoop built a refectory next to the temple in which the first Cape Parliament later held its meetings. In 1844 Sir Andries Stockenström was initiated in Lodge De Goede Hoop and Bro Schutte, the builder of the De Goede Hoop temple, passed away. In 1845 Sir John Truter passed away. On Saturday, 26 June 1847 Lodge De Goede Hoop celebrated its 75th anniversary in the De Goede Hoop temple. The first Masonic book ever published in the Cape Colony, referred to as the Yearbook of Freemasonry, was compiled by Bro De Lima, a member of the Lodge. It comprised 88 pages of articles of Masonic interest. In 1847 Bro Christoffel Brand was appointed as the Deputy Grand Master of the GEN, a position he occupied for 27 years. In 1851 the Rose Croix Chapter de Goede Hoop was formed under the AASR of the Netherlands. This Chapter still exists today, but now under the jurisdiction of the Supreme Council for the AASR for South Africa. Lodge De Goede Trouw sold its property on Bouquet Street and bought a property in St John's Street and built a temple there, which was consecrated on 4 August 1853.

In 1854 the Cape Colony elected a representative government and it met for the first time in the banqueting hall of Lodge De Goede Hoop. It continued to meet there for the next 40 years. The first meeting was presided over by Sir George Grey, the Governor and a Freemason (EC). Bro Christoffel Brand (GEN) was elected as the first Speaker of the Cape Parliament. At a meeting between the GEN and EC Rose Croix Chapters, it was agreed that EC members holding the degree of Knights Templar would be admitted to the GEN Chapters working in the Elu degree and those holding the Royal Arch degree would be admitted to workings in the degree of "Scottish Master". The GEN members would be admitted to the EC Chapters.

In 1858 Bro Johannes Brand, a son of Bro Christoffel Brand and later the President of the Orange Free State, was installed as the Presiding Master of Lodge De Goede Hoop. In 1858 the first Lodge was formed in Natal, the Port Natal Lodge (EC). The members of Lodges De Goede Hoop, De Goede Trouw, British and The Hope participated in laying the foundation stones of the South African Museum and Library in 1858 and the Somerset Hospital in 1859. In 1860 Bro Christoffel Brand was knighted by Queen Victoria and certain members of Lodge De Goede

Hoop petitioned the Grand Lodge of Scotland to grant a warrant for the formation of the first Lodge under the Scottish Constitution in Cape Town. Lodge Southern Cross was consecrated in the De Goede Hoop temple by Sir Christoffel Brand, who also installed its first Presiding Master. Later in 1860 the members of the Masonic Lodges assisted Prince Alfred, Queen Victoria's 16 year old son, to lay the foundation stone of the Sailor's Home. In 1862 Bro Marthinus Wessels Pretorius, the President of the Zuid–Afrikaanse Republiek and later the President of the Orange Free State Republic, became a "Meester van Eer" (Honorary Master) of Lodge De Goede Hoop. In the same year Royal Alfred Lodge, the second Lodge under the Scottish Constitution was formed in Cape Town.

In 1863 Sir Christoffel Brand formed the Provincial Grand Lodge of Southern Africa under the GEN. He was supported by the PGM of the EC, Bro Thomas Maclear. Bro Oloff Truter, a Past Master of Lodge De Goede Hoop and Sir John Truter's son, was appointed as the first PGM. In 1864 the first Free State Lodge was formed, The Rising Star (EC). This was followed by Losie Unie (GEN). In 1866 the first Lodge beyond the Vaal River was formed, Lodge Flaming Star (GEN). The PGM of the EC's title was changed to District Grand Master (DGM) to distinguish the areas of Masonic jurisdiction abroad from those in England. In 1868 the Lodge De Goede Hoop by-laws were translated into English and the meeting's minutes were thereafter recorded in English as most of the members could not understand Dutch. In 1870 Lodge De Goede Hoop resolved to meet on the second Wednesday of the month, which is still in force and every meeting was followed by a dinner. The gardens of the Lodge were a popular outdoor venue for the public and promenade concerts were held there. In 1872 Lodge De Goede Hoop hosted a special ceremony in the De Goede Hoop temple to commemorate its 100th anniversary, which numerous Brethren attended.
