Thank You for Celebrating with us!

We successfully celebrated 250 years of Freemasonry in South Africa during the period between 22 to 26 June 2022. On Wednesday we attended the British Lodge installation of their new Presiding Master, Wor Bro Leslie Martin, and the investiture of their officers. As is often the case in South Africa, Wor Bro Martin is not only the Master of this English Constitution Lodge but is also a member of Lodge de Goede Hoop.

On Thursday and Friday we received most of our foreign and out of town guests and a large number of persons attended the audio visual presentation called the "Magic of Masonry" in the de Goede Hoop temple on these two nights. The presenters included members of Lodge de Goede Hoop and of the English, Irish and Scottish Constitutions and the productions and the cocktails thereafter were much enjoyed by all.

On Saturday we attended the rededication ceremony of Lodge de Goede Hoop, which was formed on 2 May 1772, at which the Lodge's new banner was unfurled and the 250 year jewels were presented to the members. Following this ceremony Wor Bro Raymond Eyiomen, was installed as the new Presiding Master of the Lodge and the Officers were invested. After a light lunch, we attended the Annual Meeting of the Grand Lodge of South Africa at which a copy of the Heritage Book, representing the development of Freemasonry in South Africa in all the Constitutions over the past 250 years, was presented to me and to the leaders of the 13 foreign Grand Lodges who were officially represented at this meeting. These

ceremonies were held in the de Goede Hoop temple in the presence of about 200 brethren. On Saturday evening we attended a dinner dance at Kelvin Grove where I presented a copy of the Heritage Book to the Premier of the Western Cape Province, the Honourable Alan Winde. On Sunday we attended a lunch at the Vredenheim wine farm and bade farewell to our guests

I again thank all the members of this Grand Lodge as well as those of our Sister Constitutions in South Africa who contributed directly and indirectly to ensuring the success of this celebration. I also thank all of our member's' partners for their continued assistance, support and encouragement. I again thank RW Bro van Vuuren (England), RW Bro Alsemgeest (Ireland), Bro Gallacher (Scotland), MW Schultink (Netherlands), MW Bro Deline (Liberia), MW Bro Rollet (France), MW Bro Cleven (Belgium), MW Bro Moukala (Gabon), MW Bro Kotingan (Benin), MW Bro Bogdanov (Russia), MW Bro Dominique (Madagascar), RW Bro Neuhaus OSM (Mauritius) and MW Bro Gamito (Mocambique) and their delegations for coming along to represent their respective Grand Lodges at this celebration.

Having presented the Lodge with a Rededication Charter, the Grand Master handed the gavel to the Provincial Grand Master, RW Bro Tommy Hardiman, so that he and his team could perform the Installation. Once again, this was exceptionally well conducted and the outgoing Master, Wor Bro Malcolm Gessler, gave an excellent report and incoming Worshipful Master,

It all went very smoothly the Report and the 2021 Annual Statements were approved and the 2022 capitation fees ratified.

The Grand Master then announced the names of his $22\ /\ 23$ Grand Lodge Chain Bearers and took the



opportunity to invest RW Bro Godfrey Place as an Assistant Grand Master. VW Bro Simon Nash will be installed as the new PGM of Northern Division in July.

After obligating and investing the Grand Lodge 22 / 23 Officers, MW Bro Smith announced the names of 3 recipients of Past Grand Architect rank, being Wor Bros Cobis Wilson (SD), Alex Ndubuisi (ND) and Bushy McKelvey (ED).

The Constitution change regarding Debit Orders was unanimously approved and the Grand Secretary



was then asked to announce the Secretary of the Year. This was presented to Bro Avron Lucas (de Goede Trouw), who has caught the eye with his meticulous work

and his various creative and innovative ideas.

RW Bro Brian Rossouw OSM was then given

the opportunity to present the first "Heritage Book" copy to the Grand Master. This truly outstanding work is 1300 A4 pages long and tells the story of 250 years of South African



Freemasonry. It is a treasure that will be referred to for all things Masonic for many years to come.

The Grand Master awarded a 50 year jewel to Wor Bro Jock Wood (Marina) and a 50 year certificate to RW Bro Jim Duggan (de Goede Hoop - Honorary).

There were 5 Awards of Excellence presented this year and they were given to RW Bro Alf Bronner, RW Bro Keith Hutton, Wor Bro Bushy McKelvey, Wor Bro Marius Mostert and Wor Bro Jan Venter. All had excelled in their own way and were well received.
