A Golden Jubilee

A golden jubilee is defined as the completion of 50 years of existence, of an activity or vocation, of the membership of an organisation or some similar occasion warranting a joyous celebration. The word jubilee originates from the Hebrew word $y\bar{o}bh\bar{e}l$ meaning a ram's horn which is used as a trumpet. This instrument was used to mark Jewish religious occasions including the one observed every 50 years and known as the Year of Jubilee. The English spelling of the word was influenced by the Greek word $i\bar{o}b\bar{e}la\hat{i}os$ and the Latin word $j\bar{u}bil\bar{a}re$, both meaning to shout for joy. It appears that the word golden was added to the word jubilee in 1801 to celebrate the first 50 years of King George III as King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

This year we celebrate the golden jubilee of four members of the Grand Lodge of South Africa, being RW Bro Petrus (Piet) Johannes Naude MSA of Lodge Trichardt, Wor Bro John (Jock) Louis Wood of Lodge Marina, Wor Bro Leon Sher of Lodge Star of the East and Wor Bro Marthinus (Martin) Johannes Prinsloo of Lodge Star of the West. All these members have served their Lodges, their respective Provincial Grand Lodges and the Grand Lodge with zeal and fidelity, as is summarised below:

RW Bro Naude MSA was initiated in 1972, was duly passed and raised and served 2 terms as the WM. He also served in various offices as a PGL officer. He joined the Royal Arch Chapter Witbank and in 1981 served as the MEZ of this Chapter. He thereafter served in various offices as a PGC officer and in 1993 he was appointed as the Grand Superintendent, an office he held for 5 years. In 2000 he was elected as the First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter. He held this office for 6 years and received the Meritorious Service Award (MSA) in 2006. He is also a Past Grand Senior Warden and holds the 32^{nd} degree in the AASR for South Africa.

Wor Bro Wood was initiated in 1972, was duly passed and raised and served 3 terms as the WM of Lodge Marina and twice of Lodge Perseverance. He also served in various offices as a PGL Officer and thereafter as a Grand Tyler and Grand Inner Guard. He is a life member of the Masonic Education Fund of South Africa and has served 3 years as its chairman.

Wor Bro Sher is a Lewis and was initiated in Star of the East in 1970, was duly passed and raised and served as the WM in 1980. He also served in various offices as a PGL Officer and thereafter as a Grand Lodge Officer and holds the rank of Past Grand Ambassador. As a result of the Covid pandemic, we could unfortunately not celebrate his golden jubilee until now. His father, Wor Bro Max Sher, was also a member of Lodge Star of the East and received his 50 year long service jewel in 1994.

Wor Bro Prinsloo was initiated into Star of the West in 1971, was duly passed and raised and served as the WM in 1977. He also served in various offices as a PGL Officer and thereafter as a Grand Inner Guard, Grand Sword Bearer and Grand Banner Bearer.

It was my honour and privilege to present each of these worthy Brethren with their 50 year long service jewel and certificate. They are now exempted from paying any subscription fees to their Lodges and capitation fees to their Provincial Grand Lodge and to Grand Lodge. This is not only a remarkable achievement for each of these Brethren, but is testimony to the fact that Freemasonry is not only a worthwhile but an essential pastime for every good, honest, moral and honourable man. It has been well said that as we lose ourselves in the service of others, we discover our own lives and happiness. Brethren, we thank each of you most sincerely for your faithful and dedicated service to our Grand Lodge!
